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ONE WITH NATURE AT THE GRACE SCHOOL

When the children play outdoors they can watch butterflies at the butterfly bush, touch the soft leaves of the Lamb's ear, play in the sand box with the palm trees and sit on seats made from stumps.

"They like the different textures," said Kim Miller, a Lead teacher for More at Four. "It's good sensory interaction." Owners Amy and Mark Simmons wanted to create an outdoor learning area using natural materials. Sunflowers sprout out of tires that are used as planters, the yard is adorned with apple and fruit trees and children can enjoy the natural shade of the Weeping Willow tree.

"The children are amazed with it, and they love to help water and take care of the area," said Marsha Furr, assistant teacher for More at Four. "It is a big learning experience for them, learning about plants and the environment." In addition to learning about nature, recycling is also being taught. Milk jugs, metal cans and paper towels are all recycled each week. These materials are also used for art projects. Parents are encouraged to recycle items and bring them in for the children to use.

TUESDAYS FOR TOTS

On May 19, 2009, child care professionals and business leaders from Lincoln and Gaston Counties traveled to the North Carolina General Assembly as part of Smart Start's statewide, "Tuesdays for Tots" initiative. The constituents met with the legislative delegation from each county to discuss important issues facing young children and working families on behalf of the Partnership for Children of Lincoln & Gaston Counties.

"While recognizing that we are experiencing unprecedented economic times in North Carolina, we had successful conversations with our local legislators that an investment in early childhood is an investment in the economic future for this wonderful state," said Steve Eaton, Executive Director of the Partnership for Children of Lincoln & Gaston Counties. "As an industry, child care in North Carolina generates \$1.77 billion annually – more than the Panthers, Hurricanes, Bobcats and all spectator sports combined. It provides more than 47,000 jobs."

Tuesdays for Tots is Smart Start's signature advocacy effort that takes place every year during the legislative session. On Tuesdays, local Smart Start partnerships come to Raleigh for one-on-one meetings with legislators to educate lawmakers on Smart Start successes and discuss challenges facing young children and their families.

The group met with members of the Lincoln and Gaston County legislative delegation including: Representative William Current, Sr., Representative Johnathan Rhyne, Jr., Representative Pearl Burris-Floyd and Senator James Forrester.

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
