IPDP provides financial incentives and recognition for child care professionals who complete colleges courses.

More at Four, North Carolina's community-based pre-Kindergarten program, is now accepting applications for enrollment in the 2007-08 school year.

More at Four is designed to provide a high-quality preschool education to four-year-olds in our community. For most of the children who participate, More at Four is their first exposure to a preschool setting and readies them for success in school. Involvement in More at Four provides children with both the education and social skills they need to begin their school careers ready to learn.

The Partnership's Child Care Resource and Referral Service provides free and confidential information for families looking for child care services for children ages six weeks to 12. One of our Parent Information Assistants can help you determine your child care needs, such as location, time and days of the week; provide a list of licensed child care options that fit your needs; and provide an easy-to-use checklist of quality indicators. You can then visit the locations to find the center that is best for you and your family.

More at Four programs are located in both Gaston and Lincoln County at designated elementary schools and child care centers. The program is limited to serving children who will be four years old on or before October 16, 2007 and targets children that have not been exposed to a preschool education

or are developmentally-challenged. Eligibility for More at Four is determined by a number of criteria, including family size and gross income.
