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have found.

"These findings provide the most rigorous evidence vet that investments in these early childhood initiatives generate substantial benefits for all the children in the counties that receive these funds, even children who were never enrolled in the early childhood programs," said Helen Ladd, the Edgar T. Thompson Distinguished Professor of Public Policy and a professor of economics at Duke.

For an average third-grade child whose community had received Smart Start or More at Four funding, the expected savings in special education and instructional costs is at least equal to the cost of those programs, researchers said. "By the time the children grow up, we expect the investment will have vielded large payoffs in lower special education and remedial costs," concluded Kenneth Dodge, the William McDougall Professor of Public Policy and director of Duke's Center for Child and Family Policy.

Ninety-two cents of every Smart Start dollar goes directly to ensuring that children enter school healthy and prepared. Currently, there are 5,349 children enrolled in licensed child care centers in Gaston and Lincoln Counties and there are over 1,134 children enrolled in the More at Four program.

TUESDAYS FOR TOTS

On Tuesday, March 22, 2011, child advocates from Lincoln and Gaston Counties traveled to the North Carolina General Assembly as part of Smart Start's statewide, "Tuesdays for Tots" initiative. The constituents met with the legislative delegation from each county and asked members to maintain investments in young children in Gaston and Lincoln counties. Last year more than 800 community leaders from across the state voted that access to quality early education and care was a top priority for young children. Tuesdays for Tots is an advocacy effort that takes place every Tuesday of the legislative session. Smart Start's 77 partnerships across the state bring constituents from a variety of backgrounds, including business leaders, health professional, military families, etc., to come to Raleigh for one-on-one meetings with lawmakers. Constituents explain the challenges facing young families and how Smart Start meets these critical needs.

State funding for Smart Start has been cut by \$49 million over the last decade, \$24 million of which was cut in the last 4 years, a period when families have been increasingly suffer job losses and economic hardships and more children are living in poverty. The result is fewer services that promote children's health and early education. These cuts are occurring at the same time that economists and other business leaders are advocating that investments in young children are one of the strongest investments not only for the short term but also for sustained growth and job creation. In fact, the US Chamber of Commerce released a report highlighting North Carolina's Smart Start as a national model and saying "Early childhood education has a tremendous impact on the national economic security and the viability of the American dream." The group met with the following members of the Lincoln and Gaston County legislative delegation. They included Representative William Current, Sr., Representative Johnathan Rhyne, Jr., Representative Kelly E. Hastings, and Senator Kathy Harrington.
