Have you read to your child today?

Early literacy starts at birth. Parents should begin reading to their child in order to prepare them for later success in life. Reading will help children with speech skills and brain development. It will also create a bonding experience with the child. Based on the research by the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD), reading is the single most important skill necessary for a happy, productive and successful life. A child that is an excellent reader is a confident child! Diane Hines, Early Childhood Education Director with the Partnership for Children of Lincoln & Gaston Counties agrees that early literacy helps shape the brain. "Books allow people who never leave their home, to experience the richness of worlds far across the oceans," she said. "Without reading, we would feel isolated and alone. Children need to travel to places far away to understand their place in the universe."

Your local library is a great resource for your child. Consider the Gaston-Lincoln Regional library. In addition to finding great books there are also several programs available for children, including Preschool Story Times and Toddler Times. Mercede Walker, Children's Services Supervisor said it is important to have a special time or place to share books with your children. "Make reading important to your family and you can do that by reading to them daily," she said.
