Adolescent Parenting Program

Michelle Spinner had Carson when she was 16 years old. Having been in the Adolescent Parenting Program in Lincoln County for three years, Spinner said the program has helped her get to where she is today. "Overall the program has made me be a better Mother," Spinner said. Spinner, now 20, is working at a local bank and is loving the field. She plans to make it a career. Spinner cherishes her relationship with Jessica Towery, the APP coordinator. She said she has become a mentor for her and she appreciates the once a week visits that she provides. "She has been the perfect support-she has really matured me," Spinner said.

The Adolescent Parenting Program is open to Lincoln County residents under the age of 21 with a child or children aged birth through five. It provides support and services at no charge. Part of the program includes peer group meetings, which helps teens with education, helps build self-esteem, and helps with social skills. "We are a sound board and support for these girls," said Towery. Each peer group meeting has a different topic, which may include guest speakers. Towery also offers home visits every month, which help the parents with goal setting, parenting, education, independence and employment.

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Where's Baby? Look before you lock.

Never leave your child alone in a car!

Did you know that heatstroke is the leading cause of non-crash, vehicle-related deaths for children? According to Safe Kids USA, on average every 10 days a child dies from heatstroke in a vehicle. These deaths are preventable! Many caregivers do not realize that a child's body heats up three to five times faster than an adult's. It only takes a few short minutes before a child can become overheated. Heat stroke happens when the body cannot cool itself fast enough and the core temperature rises to dangerous levels. In a vehicle, temperatures can exceed 100 degrees in less than 10 minutes on an 80 degree day, which can be fatal. Cracking the window does nothing to reduce the temperature inside a car left in the sun. Angel Ross, Trauma Program Coordinator with CaroMont Health Trauma Services in Gastonia said that many of these deaths are because parents forgot their children were in the vehicle. There are many things you can do to remind yourself that your child is in the car including putting your child's picture on your rearview mirror. "Pay close attention and always check the backseat," she said.

Top Tips for Preventing Hyperthermia (According to Safe Kids USA). Remember ACT-Avoid, Create Reminders and Take Action! Avoid heat stroke-related injury and death by never leaving your child alone in the car, even just for a moment! Create reminders and habits that give you and your child's caregiver a safety net:

- Set the alarm on your cellphone or computer calendar as a reminder to drop your child off at childcare.
- When you drop off your child, make a habit of calling other caregivers so everyone knows where your child is at all times.
- Place an item in the backseat that is needed at your next stop such as your purse or wallet.

Take action if you see a child unattended in a vehicle. Dial 911 immediately!


