Holiday Safety Tips

The holidays are a time for gift giving. When you are shopping for toys, make sure you are getting a safe product. When shopping, read labels. Make sure the toy is well-made. Follow the safety and age information on the warning labels. Inspect all toys for potential hazards, especially small pieces that could be choking hazards. You should always supervise children when they play and set good examples of safe play.

Store toys in a safe place. Make sure toy chests have no lids or safety hinges. Keep riding toys away from stairs, traffic or swimming pools. Riding toy-related deaths can occur when a child falls from a toy or rides a toy into a body of water.
